FDA Updates

The farm utilized an NCR FSMA stipend for new resource development to purchase the necessary equipment.

NCR FSMA Evaluation Project

One of the objectives of the no-cost extension for the second round of NCR FSMA funding (2018-2021) was a long-term behavioral change study of participants who took the Produce Safety Alliance Grower Training, four to six years after taking the course.

The results have been published as "Produce Safety Alliance Training: Long-Term Behavioral Change Study in the North Central Region" in *Food Protection Trends*. If you're a member of IAFP, you can read the article online. Otherwise, you can read the abstract.

Highlighted NCR FSMA Resource



Farm Stands and U-Pick Produce Operations- Inviting customers to your farm with a Farm Stand or U-Pick is a great way to engage the public and educate consumers about agriculture in general and specifically, where and how our food is produced. In addition, hosting farm visitors can lead to other business opportunities while providing consumers with fresh fruits and vegetables essential for a healthy diet. However, inviting the public onto your farm brings

additional concerns related to safety (humans and food) and liability. You must make visitors aware of policies and procedures to protect covered produce and food contact surfaces from contamination by people and take all steps reasonably necessary to ensure that visitors comply with such policies and procedures.

New Resources on the Produce Safety Clearinghouse

A <u>compilation of existing flood resources</u> has been created for both produce growers and processors. Flooding presents a range of challenges for food growers and processors—including how to ensure safe food production. This resource collection provides a list of information and tools that food producers can refer to when understanding how to respond to flooding, including federal guidance, assessing risk, decision support, and food handling and processing recommendations. While the primary audience for this document is produce growers, there are also resources to support food processors and individuals.

Funding Available

In the past 2 months, the NCR FSMA has helped a partner attend the IAFP conference; paid for mailing a produce safety newsletter to Plain growers; and bought supplies for a handwashing station to be constructed during a workshop. How can the NCR FSMA expand your work? To access these \$500 stipends for professional development, outreach to underserved communities, or resource development/translation, apply on our website. One of each of these stipends is available to each state, per year of our grant.
