Funds Available

Trainer Sharing Program

Are you short a trainer for your class? Do you need someone to fill in for a couple of modules? We can help. The Center has funds to bring in trainers to your state to ensure every farmer has an equal chance to attend a class near them. Contact Ellen for details or formally request trainer sharing funds through our website.

Funding is available to support sending a lead trainer of the Produce Safety Alliance grower training, Preventive Controls Human Food training, or other food safety certified program training in the absence of lead trainers.

Twelve travel stipends (up to \$500 each) are available each year. All funds are distributed on a first come, first served basis.

Funding can be requested for a niche population training, but not for an individual company.

Peer Mentorship Program

Want to learn new skills to use in your role as a trainer? Looking to expand your knowledge in a particular area? The Center has a new trainer peer mentorship program. Contact Angela for more information or apply for the program on our <u>website</u>. Each pair will meet virtually and at least once in person. Eight stipends (up to \$1000 each) are available each year to cover travel expenses for the two people to meet. Four are still available for this budget year. All funds are distributed on a first come, first served basis.

Participants are expected to attend a pre-program webinar and program evaluation. Each mentoring pair will establish their own goals for the match.

Professional Development Travel Funds

In support of professional development and our mentorship program, we are offering stipends (up to \$750 each) for educators and inspectors to travel to state (cannot be in your employment state), regional, and national produce safety conferences for professional development. You will be expected to have a goal for your travel and report back impacts after the travel. Contact Angela for more information or apply for the program on our website. All funds are distributed on a first come, first served basis. Four are still available. These funds cannot be used for attending NCR FSMA annual conference, as other money is available for that.

Alternate Curriculum

FDA Updates

• An update that was shared at the Southern Center's annual meeting: As many of you know, the USDA-NIFA experienced a large loss of employees from the move to Kansas City. For 2019 projects, release of funds is stalled at the administrative review level. This process can take 30-90 days. Staff shortages and training needs of new staff is pushing the release of funds back. The grants management office had retained 2 employees from before the move, one retired in December and one is retiring in March. Funds could be released as late as March, April, or May of this year. This is an issue for 3-year FSOP projects as no-cost extensions are not an option for 3-year projects; one-and two-year projects can apply for no-cost extensions once. If you are a 2019 project awardee and have been requested to provide an annual report for the REEport you were requested to submit but haven't been issued funds for, this is in error.

The good news is that the **2020 request for applications for FSOP awards has an anticipated release date of January 31, 2020**; they don't anticipate many changes from last year's RFA. The anticipated due date is April or May of 2020. We will keep you posted as we hear more on this opportunity.

Dr. Chester will leave her position with USDA-NIFA March 1, 2020 as she is on a program track. Staff changes should be expected continue often.

- Outbreaks Emphasize the Importance of Implementing Produce Safety Standards
 Fresh produce plays an important part of an overall healthy diet. While millions of servings of fresh produce are consumed safely every day, recent outbreaks of foodborne illness have once again placed produce safety in the spotlight. The FDA must continue to build upon and implement the science- and risk-based controls envisioned by Congress through the Food Safety Modernization Act (FSMA), including those set forth in the Produce Safety Rule.

Last year was the first in which the U.S. Food and Drug Administration and state regulatory counterparts began conducting routine inspections of large farms for this rule established by FSMA. (In general, they're not addressing sprouts operations here, which have additional requirements and earlier compliance dates.) Leading up to 2019, the agency has collaborated with the National Association of State Departments of Agriculture and state partners to help prepare farmers to comply with the rule. They have also supported states in the development of their own produce safety programs.
