CDC Updates A <u>new report</u> on preliminary 2022 data from the Foodborne Diseases Active Surveillance Network (FoodNet) finds that reported enteric (intestinal) infections in the United States generally returned to or exceeded levels observed in 2016-2018, before the COVID-19 pandemic. Progress in reducing enteric infection incidence was not observed during 2022, as influences of the COVID-19 pandemic subsided.

The CDC recently released a report about Foodborne Illness Outbreaks at Retail Food Establishments. It shares that "Although a majority of managers reported their establishment had an ill worker policy, often these policies were missing components intended to reduce foodborne illness risk. Contamination of food by ill or infectious food workers is an important cause of outbreaks; therefore, the content and enforcement of existing policies might need to be re-examined and refined."

FDA Updates In June, FDA released two new fact sheets that are farm-specific related to the Traceability Rule. While there is no new information, these fact sheets provide the farm-specific information in one location in an easy to read format with links to the rule. FDA also published a new webpage with FAQ's about the Traceability Rule.

From the June 28 <u>update from FDA Commissioner Robert M. Califf</u>, M.D. "Earlier this year the FDA announced steps to modernize and streamline our food program, including field operations, to address these mounting challenges. Listening closely to feedback provided by employees and stakeholders, our thinking has significantly broadened. We know that in front of us is a once-in-a-generation opportunity to unify our field work with the priorities of program offices and Centers. This is why I'm proposing a number of additional changes to ORA, including moving several of the office's laboratories and merging its current compliance functions into those of the new HFP and other agency product Centers. These proposed changes are designed to help ensure the most strategic use of resources to meet the demands of our increasingly complex public health mission."

AFDO Updates

In June, the Association of Food and Drug Officials (AFDO) introduced a <u>Food Safety Regulatory</u> <u>Professional Credentialing program</u>.

The online courses will allow aspiring and current regulators earn credentials, including Food Safety Regulator, Food Foundations Regulator, Manufactured Foods Regulator, and Retail Foods Regulator.

These AFDO certification opportunities are provided for Local, State, Tribal, Territorial, and Federal Regulatory personnel.

The Produce Safety Alliance has a <u>new fact sheet</u> that covers the differences between an Agricultural Water System Inspection (§ 112.42) and the *proposed* Agricultural Water Assessment (AgWA) from the Food Safety Modernization Act (FSMA) Produce Safety Rule (PSR). Based on the current FSMA PSR requirements for agricultural water as well as proposed revisions to Subpart E published in 2021, this resource highlights differences in compliance dates, required frequency, evaluation parameters, and documentation requirements. This fact sheet is currently available in English and is being translated into Spanish.



Highlighted NCR FSMA Resource



<u>Domesticated Animals Factsheet</u>- Domesticated animals such as dogs, cats, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, horses, and poultry, are big challenges to on-farm food safety, both in the field and packing shed. Exclusion of all the domesticated animals from fresh produce fields and handling areas is difficult but it can be managed using appropriate strategies. Considering the extent of food safety risks associated with domesticated animals, it is necessary to set up procedures and protocols limiting potential contamination.

New Resources on the Produce Safety Clearinghouse

A Guide to Food Safety Certification for Food Hubs and Food Facilities- this resource is available in both English and Spanish. This guide is written for food hubs and other food facilities seeking information about how to navigate food safety questions from buyers and pursue a third-party food safety audit.

Funding Available

The NCR FSMA budgeted funds to support professional development, outreach to underserved communities, and resource development/translation. To access these \$500 stipends, apply on our website. One of each of these stipends is available to each state, per year of our grant.
