Federal Updates

The CDC published COVID-19 guidance for agricultural workers and employers on June 2. "There is no evidence that livestock, crops, or products that may be handled by workers involved in production agriculture are sources of COVID-19 infection. However, close contact with coworkers may contribute to spreading the virus among workers."

A companion piece to the earlier document, the Agricultural Employer Checklist for Creating a COVID-19 Assessment and Control Plan was released in mid-June.

2020 Center for Produce Safety Research Symposium

Food Safety Outreach Projects Virtual Sharing Conference August 18 - 19 (12:00-4:00 pm Central time each day)

This two half-day virtual meeting is a collaboration between the Lead Regional Coordination Center, four regional centers, and USDA NIFA to highlight Food Safety Outreach Programs throughout the country. National Young Farmers Coalition Focus Groups

The National Young Farmers Coalition is looking for produce farmers to help lead and participate in <u>online food safety focus groups</u> this summer. Each hour-long virtual focus group will feature a farmer co-facilitator discussing their operation and systems and 8 - 10 farmers asking the lead farmer questions and sharing their own experience with the topic. The farmer co-facilitator and participants will be paid for their time.

Looking for Testers

The University of Minnesota is looking for about 10 farmers to test a food safety recordkeeping app meant for small- or medium-sized farms. The app is web-based, but can be accessed via cellphones. It allows tracking of employee training, crop plantings and harvests, manure and compost applied to fields, water sources, tools, vehicles, pests, and equipment. Testers will be paid \$35 an hour for their time, and must fill out a W-9 form in order to be paid. All data will be erased after farmers' testing input is provided. Job Openings

The Division of Produce Safety (Center for Food Safety and Applied Nutrition) will soon be hiring two <u>Produce Safety Network positions</u>. The first is a CFSAN Produce Safety Network position focused on produce safety efforts in Latin America, and the second position will be a CFSAN Produce Safety Network position focused on produce safety efforts in California.

Produce Safety Alliance Temporary Policy

The PSA is <u>temporarily allowing remote delivery</u> of PSA Grower Training Courses during the COVID-19 pandemic. This policy will be in effect until *September 30, 2020*, with the potential for extending this date pending updates on the pandemic. PSA will rigorously review course evaluations under this temporary policy. PSA reserves the right to revise or rescind the remote delivery option for individual trainers or teams should evaluations indicate this is in the best interest of training participants.
