PSA Grower Training One-Year Follow-Up Survey



The impact of Produce Safety Alliance Grower Trainings in eight North Central Region states was evaluated in January 2020. Between October 2018 and June 2019, 926 participants attended a training in one of those states. They were invited to participate in the survey.

FDA and USDA Updates

The Spanish translation of the Produce Safety Rule is now available on the FDA website.

The FDA released an update on <u>surveillance inspections during COVID-19</u>.

What to Do if You Have COVID-19 Confirmed Positive or Exposed Workers in Your Food Production, Storage, or Distribution Operations Regulated by FDA is available in English and Spanish, and Chinese.

In mid-May, Mindy Brashears, and Frank Yiannas announced what the USDA and FDA are doing to help prevent interruptions at FDA-regulated food facilities, including fruit and vegetable processing facilities.

Last week, the FDA released its report on the investigation into the fall 2019 outbreaks of illnesses tied to Romaine Lettuce.

In late May, the FDA announced flexibility in the eligibility criteria for the qualified exemption from the Standards for the Growing, Harvesting, Packing, and Holding of Produce for Human Consumption (Produce Safety Rule) (21 CFR Part 112) due to disruptions to the supply chain for the duration of the COVID-19 public health emergency.
