Federal Agency Updates

- As Dr. Deirdra Chester will be on detail this spring, Dr. Jodi Williams will assume the role as the FSOP program area contact until Dr. Chester's return. The Awards Management Division is also available to answer questions about the Food Safety Outreach Program.
- Information about the Food Safety Outreach Competitive Grants was posted on February 21, 2020. Applications are due April 7. The Food Safety Outreach Program will build upon the national infrastructure, with a sustained focus on delivery of customized training to members of the target audiences. Awardees will develop and implement food safety training, education, extension, outreach and technical assistance projects that address the needs of owners and operators of small to mid-sized farms, beginning farmers, socially-disadvantaged farmers, small processors, or small fresh fruit and vegetable merchant wholesalers.

Funds Available

Trainer Sharing Program

Are you short a trainer for your class? Do you need someone to fill in for a couple of modules? We can help. The Center has funds to bring in trainers to your state to ensure every farmer has an equal chance to attend a class near them. Contact Ellen for details or formally request trainer sharing funds through our <u>website</u>.

Funding is available to support sending a lead trainer of the Produce Safety Alliance grower training, Preventive Controls Human Food training, or other food safety certified program training in the absence of lead trainers.

Twelve travel stipends (up to \$500 each) are available each year. All funds are distributed on a first come, first served basis.

Funding can be requested for a niche population training, but not for an individual company.

Peer Mentorship Program

Want to learn new skills to use in your role as a trainer? Looking to expand your knowledge in a particular area? The Center has a new trainer peer mentorship program. Contact Angela for more information or apply for the program on our <u>website</u>. Each pair will meet virtually and at least once in person. Eight stipends (up to \$1000 each) are available each year to cover travel expenses for the two people to meet. Four are still available for this budget year. All funds are distributed on a first come, first served basis.

Participants are expected to attend a pre-program webinar and program evaluation. Each mentoring pair will establish their own goals for the match.

Professional Development Travel Funds

In support of professional development and our mentorship program, we are offering stipends (up to \$750 each) for educators and inspectors to travel to state (cannot be in your employment state), regional, and national produce safety conferences for professional development. You will be expected to have a goal for your travel and report back impacts after the travel. Contact Angela for more information or apply for the program on our <u>website</u>. All funds are distributed on a first come, first served basis. Four are still available. These funds cannot be used for attending NCR FSMA annual conference.

Alternate Curriculum

Is your alternate curriculum ready to be reviewed? Are you in the beginning stages of developing a new curriculum? The NCR FSMA, in conjunction with the Lead Regional Center, the FDA, the USDA, and other partners, has developed a review process. The review process is free for any group or organization who is developing an alternate curriculum. It is designed to be a clear process to help developers meet the equivalency standards.

Highlighted Resource

The FSMA Produce Rule Summary for Midwest Orchards includes checklists and rule citations. It covers Worker Health, Hygiene, and Training; Food Safety During Harvest; Pre-Harvest Handling of Fruit; Record Keeping; and U-Pick Customers and Visitors.

New resources from Michigan State University

"Am I Covered?" Online Assistant

The single most asked question FDA has fielded in their Technical Assistance network is "Am I covered under the Produce Safety Rule?" The answer is very specific to the farm asking the question and often requires a grower to consult a flow chart. In order to reach a broader audience, the team created an online assistant to help growers determine their coverage.

Wildlife Scouting Simulator

The simulator leads the viewer through a simulated pre-harvest wildlife assessment. The viewer is able to choose what areas of the field to scout, record their observations, and make a management decision on what they believe is safe to harvest. This project also includes a video at the beginning and end to provide further information on pre-harvest wildlife scouting.
