# FDA Updates

- FDA is seeking public comments on the paperwork and regulatory burdens associated with its regulatory program which "... requires that persons who manufacture, process, pack, hold, receive, distribute, transport, or import food in the United States establish and maintain records identifying the immediate previous sources and immediate subsequent recipients of food ...".The deadline to submit comments is June 8.
- FDA's perspective on food safety and availability during and beyond COVID-19, an interview with Frank Yiannis, was released April 16.

Applicants should focus on critical and urgent research, extension, or integrated solutions in response to the COVID-19 pandemic and its impacts on the nation's food and agricultural system. Applications should include strategies and knowledge that can be rapidly implemented to minimize or eliminate COVID-19 impacts on the nation's food and agricultural system. Deadline to submit applications is June 4. NIFA will expedite application evaluation & awards review to ensure rapid project start-up. # Produce Safety Alliance Temporary Policy

The PSA is <u>temporarily allowing remote delivery</u> of PSA Grower Training Courses during the COVID-19 pandemic. This policy will be in effect until *July 31, 2020*, with the potential for extending this date pending updates on the pandemic. PSA will rigorously review course evaluations under this temporary policy. PSA reserves the right to revise or rescind the remote delivery option for individual trainers or teams should evaluations indicate this is in the best interest of training participants. This July date is a recent update.
