We were able to fund several projects to translate existing videos and webinars, one to create a needs assessment, and two projects that will create new resources.

Federal Updates



On April 6, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration took two important steps to advance the safety of leafy greens. The first is the release of a report on the investigation into the Fall 2020 outbreak of E. coli O157:H7 illnesses linked to the consumption of leafy greens. In addition, the FDA also released an updated version of the Leafy Green

Shiga-toxin producing E. coli (STEC) Action Plan, reaffirming the need for collaborative action to improve the safety of leafy greens, and building on the work accomplished in 2020.

Manuscript Invitations

The Journal of Amish & Plain Anabaptist Studies (JAPAS) is interested in receiving submissions for a special issue focusing on agriculture and the environment, to be published autumn 2021. Areas of interest include: agricultural practice, extension/outreach projects, agricultural safety and health, environmental impacts and conservation, nature studies, history of agriculture, agricultural economics, views of science, and other related topics.

Dr. Sanja Ilic, from the Ohio State University is the new co-editor for a special issue of Foods. If you and your team are conducting behavioral research on food safety, you are invited to submit a manuscript to the special issue "Food Safety and Behavior Change" within the Food Quality and Safety section. The deadline for manuscript submissions is December 20, 2021.

Purdue University announced a <u>Request for Applications</u> for the <u>Feed the Future Innovation Lab</u> <u>for Food Safety</u>. They are funding research partnerships to reduce the burden of foodborne illness in Africa, Asia, and the Caribbean. Projects must be led by a researcher at a Minority Serving Institution (MSI), but project teams may include non-MSIs and other organizations as collaborators.

Partner Events

Registration is open for a <u>Bridging the GAPs</u>: Approaches for Treating Pre-harvest Agricultural Water On-Farm course. This is an FSOP project from the Southern Center members. This course will take place May 18-19, from 12:00-4:00 pm, Central time, on Zoom. Registration is \$15.

Michigan State University researchers are conducting <u>a study to assess buyer requirements for</u> <u>produce safety standards</u> in the United States. This survey research is seeking responses from growers, buyers, and service providers to the fresh produce industry. The focus of this research is to understand the current status of buyers' acceptance and growers' adoption of USDA GAP (Good Agricultural Practices), other Harmonized GAP, and group produce audits. The survey is open until May 15, 2021.
