FDA Updates

The FDA New Era of Smarter Food Safety <u>Summit on E-Commerce</u>: <u>Ensuring the Safety of Foods Ordered Online and Delivered Directly to Consumers</u> will take place virtually October 19-21, 2021. The summit is designed to help the agency improve its understanding of how human and animal foods are sold through Business to Consumer (or B2C for short) e-commerce models across the U.S. and globally.

During the three-day event, there will be opportunities for public comment each day. Participants who wish to speak during the public comment sessions must register as indicated in the Federal Register Notice by October 8, 2021.

There is no cost to attend the summit, but registration is required.



The winners of the <u>FDA Traceability Challenge</u> have been announced. Twelve of 90 submissions were presented at a webinar in late September. The FDA's goal of the contest was to help achieve end-to-end traceability – from source to table – throughout the food safety system.

One of the winners of the competition was Iowa Valley Resource Conservation and Development! Their staff presented about their Clean Start program (which utilized a minigrant from the NCR FSMA) at a recent listening session. As part of the Clean Start program, they developed the FarmTabs traceability program.

New Resources

The Artisan Grain Collaborative and the Center for Agriculture and Food Systems at Vermont Law School are pleased to share a new guide for food-grade grain farmers and processors. Titled "Understanding FSMA's Preventive Controls Rule: A Guide for Grain Businesses," the guide breaks down complicated federal food safety regulations related to the Food Safety Modernization Act's (FSMA) Preventive Controls for Human Food Rule (PCR). It aims to help farmers and processors identify which food safety requirements apply to their particular operations and assist them in understanding what they need to do to comply as they work to build local and regional food systems.

The <u>Produce Safety Rule is now available in Korean and Japanese</u>. The PSR is also available in Spanish, Chinese, and Portuguese.

United Fresh offers a virtual <u>Produce GAPs Harmonized Standard Auditor Training</u>, October 18-21, featuring 4 half-day sessions. This course utilizes the official training materials developed by the Produce GAPs Harmonization Initiative Calibration Committee, designed to standardize food safety auditors' use and expectations of the combined Pre- and Post-harvest Harmonized Standards.

The Center for Produce Safety announced its annual call for preliminary research proposals. Pre-Proposals and required documents should be <u>emailed to CPS</u> by 2:00 Central time on Wednesday, November 10, 2021.
