

WHAT IS A BSAAO?

A biological soil amendment which consists, in whole or in part, of materials of animal origin, such as manure or non-fecal animal byproducts, or table waste alone or in combination.

TREATED VS. UNTREATED

TREATED BSAAO

Treated BSAAOs have gone through a complete process to adequately reduce microorganisms of concern.

UNTREATED BSAAO

Untreated BSAAO, such as raw manure, have not gone through an appropriate process to kill any potential pathogens.

SAFE AND SUCCESSFUL COMPOSTING

Acceptable time and turning regimes outlined by FSMA:


Static pile that reaches 131° F for 3 consecutive days

Active or turned pile that reaches 131° F for 15 non-consecutive days, with a minimum of 5 turnings



RECORDKEEPING

For purchased compost, you need:

A Certificate of Conformance

For BSAAOs produced on your own farm, you need:

- Records outlining the scientific validity of the process used
- Time, temperature, and turning records showing the process was followed on the farm

In the eyes of an inspector, if you didn't write it down, it didn't happen.

FARM FOOD SAFETY PLANS

What is a Farm Food Safety Plan?

- Describes identified risks and corrective actions
- Defines your practices, policies, and SOPs (Standard Operating Procedures)
- Prepares you for buyer questions and third party audits

What is an SOP?

Created by writing down what you do and how you do it- EXACTLY! Food safety
plans and most
SOPs are NOT
required for
FSMA
compliance.
